## **Pastoral Ponderings**

Several of the Psalms begin with these words, "Sing unto the Lord with a new song." No Psalm ever began, "Sing unto the Lord the same old song." Yet, more often than not we like the same old song. We are familiar with the same old song. We know the notes and the words are committed to memory. But the Word of the Lord says sing new song.

The period between pastors gives us an opportunity to reflect on what song we are singing. Perhaps you have caught on that I am not talking about music, but about the past, the present, and the future. What is our future as a church? Where do we want to be in the next five years, ten, or fifteen? Do we actually think that the next five, ten, or more years our church life is going to be as it has been? Most importantly, where do we think the Lord is calling us to be and what do you think the Lord is calling us to be in the years ahead?

Domino's Pizza has begun a major renovation of its stores nationwide because it knows that if people are going to buy the pizza they have to be attracted to the place that makes the pizza. Anchor stores in malls; Sears, Macy's, and Penny's are going through difficult times, as well as stores associated with more youthful tastes such as the Gap. They are considered the same old song by consumers. People take pictures on their phones and don't use road maps because they have a GPS. Malls are going out of business because of online shopping. Likewise, here in York there is a perception among some that our church is simply a summer chapel. We cannot afford to sing the same old song, not matter how comforting it may be, or soon it will become the dirge that accompanies us to the grave.

We have the most important message in the world, the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. We have been commissioned to go into the world with that message and make disciples of all nations.

We know we have a good product, in fact the greatest. The question is how is that product delivered? How does it meet the needs of twenty first century Americans under the age of forty? Like Domino's, we know we have a good product, but what are we doing to attract people to that product. There are plenty of other attractions out there, what would draw someone unto us?

These are questions upon questions for us to ponder during this in between time. There are no easy answers. But this is the time to raise them and ponder them. This is the time for our church's serious self-examination. This is the time to ask the "What if..." questions. This is the time to bring thoughts and ideas to the members of the pulpit committee. This is the time to sit down and start composing a new song to sing to the Lord because the old one we have been singing just may be out of date.
