A PROFOUND NEED

The annual **One Great Hour of Sharing Offering** (OGHS) will be taken during the

summer, from July 17 through the end of August. The overall purpose of this offering is to relieve the needs of individuals throughout the world. This year's theme verse of **'Where you go I will go'** (Ruth 1:16), which was spoken by Ruth to Naomi as she chose to be with her instead of staying in her homeland, is so appropriate given the plight of refugees from and in so many places.



Last year funds from this offering helped refugees in Hungary, Lebanon, Myanmar, and Serbia, as well as individuals affected by floods in India, drought in Nicaragua, and earthquakes in Thailand.

PLUS here in the United States people impacted by fire in California, winter storms in Massachusetts, mudslides in Washington state, and floods in New York all received assistance through this offering. For more examples of how God works through the OGHS offering go to www.abc-oghs.org.

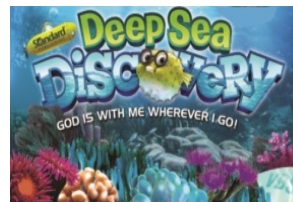
Jumping July Faith Crafting.....
